A group can be as few as two or as many as you can gather. Consider bringing this toolkit with you to the next gettogether of any group you are a part of.

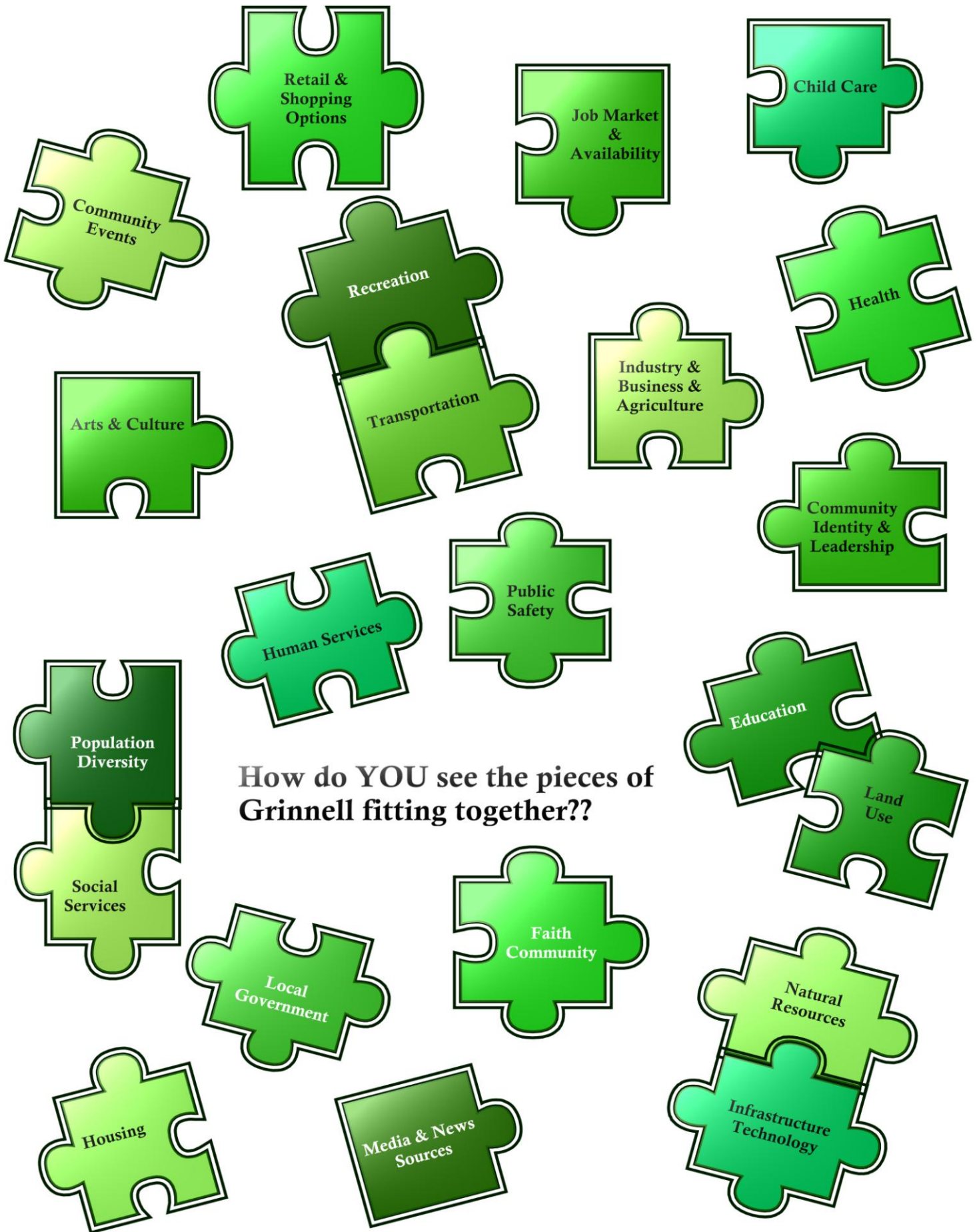
Remember, if you are a part of multiple groups, you can participate as many times as you like!
